DO'S:

Always include a personalized note with your invitation.

Always check your spelling and grammar.

Be specific on WHY you want to connect with them.

Always respond to a new connection with a thank you and take the initiative to connect further.

Provide 2-3 times frames for a conversation to avoid going back and forth.

Provide preferred contact information (via phone, email, Zoom, etc.).


DON'TS:
